Disc Golf Discussion

The Parks and Rec Board has, over the past several months, received two proposals from the Cannon Valley Disc Golf group to locate a disc golf course within Dundas. Their first proposed location was the City park area along Armstrong Road and Mill Towns Road, adjacent to Stoneridge Hill, that is currently undeveloped, and their second proposed location was at the Regional Park, just north of the new dog park.

The Park Board discussed the two locations and have determined that:

- 1) The undeveloped parkland near the Stoneridge Hills residential development is not adequate enough in size to accommodate a parking lot and in street parking isn't directly adjacent to the park.
- 2) The Regional Park area north of the new dog park has been identified as the future expansion area of the dog park leaving too little space for a disc golf course.

The Park Board tried to think of another location that would be suitable for a disc golf course and could not think of another one.

Motion by Ringel, seconded by Rice to have staff draft a letter to the Cannon Valley Disc Golf group notifying them of their decision to remove the placeholder from the Capital Improvement Plan. MCU

WELCOME TO THE DOG EXERCISE AREA

- **Park Hours: Sunrise to Sunset.**
- **Dogs must be under handler's control.**
- **Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and upon exiting exercise area.**
- **Handlers must remain with their dogs at all times.**
- **No more than two dogs per handler.**
- **Proof of rabies vaccination must be in possession.**
- **Handlers must clean up after their dogs.**
- **No glass or food or beverages allowed.**

Street parking only

Welcome to the Dundas Dog Park

This area is dedicated to provide a safe, fun, and welcoming experience at the Dundas Dog Park for our canine friends and their responsible devoted owners. This is an off-leash park. Hours are sunrise to sunset.

Maximum of 2 dogs per visitor. Owners are legally responsible for their dogs actions, waste clean up, and to dispose of waste in the trash receptacles.

Aggressive dog (or human) behavior is not tolerated. Dogs need to respond to voice commands. Off-leash does not mean out of control.

You must be 16 years of age to supervise a dog. Children under 12 years old are not permitted in the park.

Gates must be closed and latched upon entering or leaving the park.

If you bring a dog toy, leave with the toy. Please do not donate tennis balls to the park.

Do not move picnic tables or other placed furniture.

The following is not allowed in the park:

- Female dogs in heat
- Sick dogs
- Puppies younger than 4 months or dogs that are not current with vaccines including Rabies
- Wolf breeds of any kind
- Unattended dogs

The Dundas Dog Park is not responsible or liable for injury or damages.
