City Planner Sparks reviewed the draft Business Subsidy Policy, pointing out areas where amendments to the original policy have been updated to reflect current Minnesota State Statutes and areas where it aligns with the City's goals for development that are set forth in the Comprehensive Plan.

Review and Discuss Rice County's Proposed Single Family Housing Tax Abatement Plan Administrator Teppen reviewed Rice County's proposed plan to abate the County's share of taxes for an at this time undetermined period of time for the construction of single family and multi family homes that is proposed to be modeled on a plan from Lyon County, Minnesota. Rice County officials held a meeting in which representatives from cities across Rice County were in attendance to hear their proposed plan.

Review and Discuss Rice County's Proposed Single Family Housing Tax Abatement Plan EDA members questioned why the policy was not directed to workforce or affordable housing and questioned the underlying factors driving the County to consider such a plan as it seems to further the perception that the urban areas of the county are supporting the rural areas.

RE: Business Retention and Expansion Survey

Background

The EDA is working on a few initial steps concurrently. These steps will help define the future actions of the EDA.

- 1) Business Subsidy Policy. The City has updated the business subsidy policy to allow for the use of various tools to assist new and existing businesses.
- 2) Development Barriers Map. The City is making a map to identify and market key available properties. Some properties require a bit of work to become usable. These issues are being identified.
- 3) Business Park. The City is analyzing a property for the establishment of a business park. The evaluation will result in cost estimates for future discussion.
- 4) Existing Business Survey. While exploring the establishment of programs and establishing budgetary needs for targeting new businesses, the needs and growth potential of existing businesses should also be considered. Many City goals could be reached by helping existing businesses expand. Part of this process is making an inventory of existing businesses.

To assist in finding out the needs and goals of existing businesses, a draft survey is being developed. The proposed survey questions are being presented to the EDA for discussion. After this discussion, the survey will be finalized and sent out to the businesses on the final inventory list.

The goal of the survey is to:

- Identify immediate concerns of the businesses
- Identify training and technical assistance needs
- Identify future plans for the businesses
- Show the community's appreciation for the businesses
- Develop an economic development plan designed to improve the local business climate
- Foster local action through the creation of local implementation action plans

Survey Review

The EDA should review the survey and provide comments. The idea is to find out what the businesses in the City need or wish to achieve in the future. The responses will allow the EDA to make goals and identify programs in the future.
